Item No. 70.04 : To consider the recommendation of the committee constituted for revision of rules and guidelines for institution of sponsored medals/ scholarship etc.

Resolution : The Senate considered the recommendations of the Committee constituted for revision of rules and guidelines for institution of sponsored medals/ scholarship etc. and resolved to recommend the same to the Board of Governors for approval. A copy of the recommendations of the Committee for revision of rules and guidelines for institution of sponsored medals as recommended by the Senate is enclosed at **ANNEXURE-IV**.

Item No. 70.05 : To discuss the change in existing course structure of UG, PG and Ph.D. programmes of the Institute as per the New Education Policy (NEP) – 2020.

Resolution : The Senate considered the proposal of the Dean (Academic) on National Education Policy (NEP) – 2020 and agreed in principle that the guidelines for design of a new B.Tech. programme for students joining through all India entrance test (JEE Main) after 10+2 (existing scheme)/ 5+3+3 National Education Policy (NEP) – 2020 should have:

A. Total number of credits for the four-year degree may be between 160 -180.

- B.** First semester shall be common for all branches.
- C.** (i) Certification in Engineering Foundation may be awarded to a student after completing **one year** of residential academic requirements with minimum CPI of 5.0 without ACD in any one of the 2 semester in event of any student leaves the Institute for any reasons.
- (ii) Diploma in the appropriate branch can be awarded to a student after completing **two years** of residential academic requirements with minimum CPI of 5.0 without ACD in any one of the 4 semester in the event the any student leaves the institute for any reasons.
- (iii) Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in the appropriate branch of Engineering can be awarded to a student after completing **three years** of residential academic requirements with minimum CPI of 5.0 in the event the any student leaves the institute for any reasons without ACD in any previous semesters.
- (iv) Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech.) in the appropriate branch with either a specialization in the specific area of department or minor in the appropriate field (if the field is different than the respective branch) can be awarded to a student after completing **four years** of residential academic requirements with minimum CPI of 5.0 without ACD in any one of the 8 semester.

For example: A student complete 6 semester with Electrical Engineering and he opts for minor in Power Electronics & Drives / Power System / Control Instrumentation specialization of the department, his B.Tech. degree will be B.Tech. in Electrical with specialization in Power Electronics & Drives / Power System / Control Instrumentation.

However, a student complete 6 semester with Electrical Engineering and he opts for minor in Artificial Intelligence offered from Computer Science, his B.Tech. degree will be B.Tech. in Electrical Engineering with Minor in Artificial Intelligence



(iv) Minimum number of credits for certification, diploma and B.S. and B. Tech. (with specialization or minor) will be as given below:

Further, the Senate further resolved that the departments may deliberate further on the Course structure / Course Curriculum on the above lines & recommendation on the Departmental Committees and DFAC of the Department in this regard may be discussed at the institute level Committee such as SUGC. Recommendation on the Institute level Committee (SUGC) may be placed before the Senate for consideration.

Item No. 70.06 : To consider the request of Mr. Amit Shukla for Institution of a new Sponsored Gold Medal in the name of his father Dr. Satya Sheel, Electrical Engineering, Former Professor, MNNIT Allahabad.

Resolution : The Senate considered the request made by Mr. Amit Shukla son of Dr. Satya Sheel, ex-Professor Electrical Engineering Department MNNITA Prayagraj for institution of a new Gold Medal sponsored by him in the name of his father Dr. Satya Sheel and resolved to recommend the same to the Board of Governors for approval. This newly instituted sponsored medal named as "Prof. Satya Sheel Gold Medal" will be awarded to overall first position holder in Electrical Engineering (final year) students of the B.Tech. programme.

Subject: Regarding conduction of Exam in the current semester

In view of the uncertainties prevailing due to COVID-19, various modes of examination are being explored. Following options for the exams along with their limitations and benefits are presented below:

1) End Semester Examination in Physical mode.

- a) It is possible to conduct End Semester Examination in physical mode (conventional method), in scattered manner. To have strict adherence to COVID guidelines of physical distancing, adequate sanitization etc, it is proposed to schedule End Semester Exam for various courses in separate time intervals. Please find enclosed herewith the proposed Exam Schedule draft [**Annexure-I**] for the current semester [session 2020-21 Even Semester] Exam.
- b) The duration of the overall examination process will stretch to more than four months [10 April -28 August 2021]. Longer Exam duration will be needed for regulating the delayed start of various courses.

2) Online End Semester Examination [As implemented in previous semester].

- a) Approved Guidelines for just concluded Online End Semester Examination are as follows:
 1. Theory exam of 60 marks will be divided into two components :
 - i. Online written Exam of 40 marks; duration of exam will of 2 hrs and additional 20 minutes will be provided for pdf file creation and uploading of the Answer file
 - ii. Viva-voce of 20 marks will be conducted by the course instructor. [Detailed Guideline is attached herewith as **Annexure –II.**]
- b) In light of the experience gained and the feedbacks received, it is proposed to increase the viva component of the End Semester Exam from 20 marks to 30 marks.

3) Proctored Online End Semester Examination.


- a) In the Proctored Online Examination, each examinee is required to keep his/her video in switch on mode, during the exam period.
- b) It will be required to subscribe/ procure the services for proctored examination from competent vendor. Please find the Online Examination platform feature along with

price quotations, from School Guru Eduserve Private Limited, for ready reference.

[ANNEXURE-III]

- c) However, it must be emphasised that the continuous video streaming, which is must for proctored exam, requires high data rate/ bandwidth. There is a major technical limitation in terms of guaranteed high data rate requirement at the student's end. In the past, it was experienced that many students residing in rural and remote areas, found difficulty in even uploading the "Answer File".



 - The schedule for the online written exam will be provided by the Examination Cell.
 - Viva-voce will be conducted by the course instruction at the time of showing the Evaluated Answer Sheets to the students.
 - In the viva-voce, questions may be asked from the student based on the answer given in the answer sheet as well as other questions.





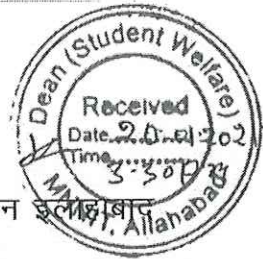

Guidelines for institution of new Medals/Scholarship/Awards/Prizes etc.

1) Objective of institution of sponsored scholarships, prizes and medals to students

- (i) In order to promote an outstanding or excellent academic performance, excellence in a given course of the program, excellence in research, social service, games and sports, cultural activities, participation in students counseling, participation and constructive leadership in gymkhana involving all round overall performance.
- (ii) In order to financially assist meritorious students coming from weaker economic background and girl students.
- (iii) Financial assistance for encouraging innovation and entrepreneurship among the students.

2) Name for Scholarship/Medal/Awards and Prizes.

The Scholarship/Medal/Awards and Prizes shall be in the name of renowned personality/Institution/person related to the Institute with significant contribution or their beloved in the field of Engineering/Technology/Sciences/Management and have/had added glory to the Institute / Nation.

3) Method of endowment/donation and disbursement:

The scholarship/prize/award/medal will be given to the student(s) from the principal amount deposited and interest earned from the principal amount. The minimum required principal amount is given in point number 5.

4) Duration: The time period for Institution of Scholarship/Medal/Awards and Prizes may be

- (a) It may be one time or more than one times for the case of Awards and Prizes
- (b) For scholarships/medals, the duration for the purpose of calculation of endowment shall be normally ten years. The scholarships/medals will continue till the fund (principal + interest earned) becomes insufficient for disbursement of minimum amount of Scholarship /Medal / Awards and Prizes in the coming year.






The minimum scholarship per student per year may be the tuition fee/mess fee/a fixed amount not less than Rs.20,000.00 per student per year (This amount is subject to

revision by the committee time to time keeping view of the inflation rate after every five years). Accordingly, the minimum required endowment shall be as per the proposed minimum scholarship and duration as per point 4.

B. Sponsored Medal:

To give a medal for a period of ten years a minimum endowment of Rs. 1.00 lakh shall be required. For more duration, the amount may be calculated on pro-rata basis.

The weight & size of the medal to be instituted [40] grams of silver (purity at least 99%) with gold plating shall be same as that of other Institute medals. Sponsoring authority may not be allowed for suggesting any change in the medal to institute.

C. Sponsored Awards and Prizes

- This will be either cash and/or means.
- The minimum amount for award/ prizes shall be Rs. 5000/- per student. Accordingly, the endowment will depend on the proposed amount and duration selected as per point 4.
- This will be applicable for academic activities/ Extracurricular activities such as games/cultural/literary events etc.


6) Eligibility and Conditions:


Following will be the conditions for institution of new scholarship etc.:

- (a) Academic requirement for award of new medals/scholarship/awards/prizes etc. will be:
- (i) Passed all previous semester examinations in first attempt.
 - (ii) CPI not less than 6.5 and 7.5 for U.G. and P.G. students respectively.
 - (iii) Means of a student may be one of the criteria.
 - (iv) The sponsor may impose any condition over and above given on Point Nos. 6(i to iii) and 6(iv) above. He/she may give conditions related to branch/ number of beneficiary students/ amount.
 - (v) No disciplinary action on record
- (b) In the event of a tie the committee as per point 9 will resolve the same.
- (c) A recipient of a scholarship/medal/award/prize under these rules is expected to maintain, besides satisfactory academic progress, regularity in attendance and good conduct, behaviour and discipline in the Department and in the Institute/Hostel. In the event of a recipient being found to be involved in any act of misconduct, misbehavior, indiscipline or adopting unfair means in an examination, the award or

7) Sponsor

The sponsor of Scholarship/Awards/Prizes/Medals may be:

- (b) Any individual/Institution with high moral and ethical values recognized by the society.

8) Procedure




The Committee deliberated on the suggestions given by the Senate members in its Sixty-eighth [68th] Senate meeting held on October 28, 2020 for the nomination of senate nominees as members to the Board of Governors of the Institute and after detailed deliberations recommends the following:

1. One Professor and one Associate Professor/ Assistant Professor by rotation may be nominated. Further, there will be again rotation amongst Associate Professor and Assistant Professor also.
2. Faculty members may be nominated for maximum of two terms as nominee of the Senate to the Board of Governors. One term as Assistant Professor/ Associate Professor and the other term as Professor.
3. Nominations may be made in order of seniority in the respective cadre.
4. The Institute may prepare the seniority list of the faculty members at the earliest before the next nomination becomes due. In case, seniority list of faculty members is not available before the date of Senate meeting to decide such nomination, the Senate may decide nomination of members by consensus.

5. Nominations of the Senate nominees as members of Board of Governors may not be considered, if the proposed nominee of the senate is due to retire within a period six months from the date of nomination.
6. The preparation of seniority list may be expedited.
